

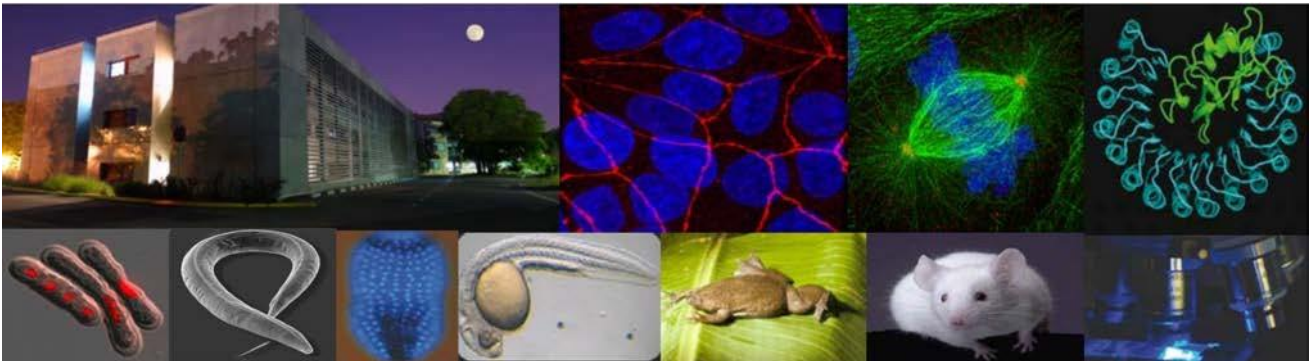

Open Position for Director of the CRBM in Montpellier



A Director position is available for the 2027-2032 mandate at the Cell Biology Research Center of Montpellier (CRBM, www.crbm.cnrs.fr). The mandate starts on Jan. 1st, 2027, renewable once.

The CRBM is a leading research institute in the fields of biochemistry, cell biology, and genetics. Research focuses on the factors and mechanisms controlling cell division, signaling, adhesion, migration, and gene expression, in a variety of physiological contexts including normal and cancer cell proliferation, cellular responses to stress, development, morphogenesis, and endosymbiosis. Affiliated with the CNRS and the University of Montpellier, the institute hosts about 160 research scientists at all career stages with a wide range of expertise, working within 18 independent groups.

The CRBM benefits from an exceptional scientific and technological environment, through the Biocampus infrastructure (www.biocampus.fr), which provides access to 18 facilities in Montpellier, including imaging, proteomics, genomics, metabolomics, and animal facilities. The CRBM hosts most resources of the imaging facility (MRI, www.mri.cnrs.fr), a Zebrafish and Xenopus facility (ZEFIX-Biocampus), and a high-throughput cloning and screening facility (MGC, www.mgc.cnrs.fr).

The CRBM is a member of the Pôle "Biology & Health" of the University, which brings together 500 researchers, the Montpellier SIRIC cancer network, the EpiGenMed network, and the recently awarded I-SITE MUSE. The CRBM is located on the CNRS "route de Mende" campus, which hosts four INSB research units with a total of 450 scientists (CEPIMAI, IGMM, IRIM & CRBM, organized into a Federation - BIOLuM), the INCs Balard Chemistry Center with about 700 scientists, and the INEEs Centre d'Ecologie Fonctionnelle et Evolutive (CEFE) with about 350 scientists, providing an exceptionally rich and diverse interdisciplinary environment.

The Director will develop an ambitious strategic vision for the institute, promoting scientific quality, as well as local, national, and international visibility. He/she will show leadership and management skills and an ability to interact with a diversity of individuals, at all levels, inside and outside the institute. Candidates should hold a position at a French research organization, including the CNRS, INSERM, the University of Montpellier, or possibly at another French university.

Applications must include a detailed CV, a mission statement describing their strategic vision, and should be sent to search-committee@crbm.cnrs.fr. The position is open until filled.
